PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS

Partnering to maximize impact

LAND CONSERVATION PROGRAM

"What matters most is not who protects the land, but that the land gets protected from future development, so the rural character of the Torch Lake Watershed is preserved for generations."

- With the Grand Traverse Land Conservancy, we discussed opportunities for future cooperation and agreed to share responsibilities in our Watershed.
 TCC will work with projects of 80 acres or fewer, and GTRLC will deal with projects on parcels over 80 acres.
- Walloon Lake Land Trust & Conservancy shared their experiences with conservation. They have focused on a single watershed for almost 40 years. Their success is an inspiration.
- Heart of the Lakes, the collective voice for Michigan's land conservancies, provided assistance and useful guidance. We participated in their two summits and benefitted from information on effective land conservation practices and programs.
- Our land specialist Keith Ross met with interested landowners to discuss first steps in land conservation. He also educated our Board about land conservation tools and provided additional information for our website.
- Antrim County forester Mike Meriwether, provided suggestions for our new program. Since 62% of our watershed is covered by forest, learning more about the condition of our woods is critical to our mission.
- Heart of the Lakes sponsored a Forest Conservation & Stewardship Workshop in the fall. Three of our Board members attended and began developing a forest stewardship plan for the Torch Lake Watershed with assistance from the U.S.D.A.

• Torch Conservation Center assisted John Fosgitt, Compass Land Consulting, in organizing the Northern Michigan Forest Initiative. The initiative is interested in forming a large group of forest landowners who can be certified by the Forest Stewardship Council. The goal of this certification is to ensure that Michigan forests are sustainably managed now and in the future. Regional land conservancies will continue exploring this exciting opportunity.

FRESHWATER STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

- The Antrim Conservation District and TCC developed a plan to eradicate the invasive species purple loosestrife at 15 sites around Torch Lake. The sites had been identified in a survey conducted by Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council in 2015. In 2016 the Charlevoix, Antrim, Kalkaska, Emmet Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area (CAKE CISMA) contacted landowners and removed plants on half of the sites.
- The Elk River Chain of Lakes Watershed Watershed Plan Implementation Team (WPPIT) meets monthly to update partners on their various projects. Our Board members participate in these meetings.
- Through the Torch Lake Coalition, TCC Board chair Peg Comfort met regularly with the executive directors from the Three Lakes Association and the Torch Lake Protection Alliance to discuss ways our organizations can collaborate to work more effectively within the Torch Lake Watershed.




