

Our online community totals 12,971 people.





Building a Vibrant Torch Lake Community

"It takes a village" to ensure that Torch Lake stays Clean, Clear and BLUE!

That's why it's so important that we all work together. We're proud to partner with landowners, local businesses and nonprofit organizations, as well as individuals, to promote stewardship in the Torch Lake Watershed.

Nonprofit partnerships

We're part of the Elk River Chain of Lakes Watershed Protection Plan Team which meets regularly with 19 other nonprofits and government reps to share information.

We are partners with Torch Lake Protection Alliance and Three Lakes Association and have formed the Torch Lake Steering Committee to review, recommend and coordinate joining projects. This group works to promote informed lawn care practices, shoreline protection, and water quality assessment.

2021 Joint Projects

- Lawn Care Campaign: Distributing "Don't Fertilize" signs to 100 more landowners
- Shoreline Stewardship Campaign: Developing and distributing three postcards to 1500 waterfront landowners

Local Businesses

We engage with more than 50 local businesses-hiring local contractors to build our checkout counter, installing watershed signs on business properties, designing and distributing educational materials, creating a native plant garden to name a few.

Working with Our Partners

Three nonprofits serve Torch Lake, each focusing on what they do best. We share resources—people, time and money—to improve communications to the community we serve and increase our impact on Torch Lake's future.

Bob Milliron - Kewadin, Michigan Torch Lake Protection Alliance (TLPA)

After selling his manufacturing business in 2021, he and his wife found a home on Torch Lake. Shortly thereafter, he became involved with the TLPA Program Committee and now serves as the Board Vice-chair.

When fellow committee members referred to Torch Conservation Center's website, Bob checked it out and was impressed, not just with the "technical and biological knowledge, but the historical knowledge of what has worked and what hasn't," Bob comments. He also stopped by the TRUE BLUE Gallery in Alden and picked up free educational materials. He thinks, "They're fantastic, because they're concise and give ideas for steps you can take in your own home and yard."

He can't say enough about TRUE BLUE News, our monthly e-news with specific tips to care for Torch Lake. He even forwards it to other folks and encourages them to take positive steps, too. "Torch Conservation Center is about education, but in a different way," he says.

"TCC has the ability to convey technical information, so ordinary folks can understand and take action. Plus, they're willing to share the information with other groups, which has led to two collaborative projects among the three Torch Lake groups."

Bob thinks this collaboration is key to protecting Torch Lake for the future.

"Everyone can make a difference in caring for the lake—and if we do, Torch Lake's cleanliness and beauty will endure."


