

Strengthening Local Partnerships

We engaged with 34 Community Partners in 2022!

Collaboration is the key to a strong community. We're proud to partner with local businesses, landowners (both on and off the lake) and nonprofit organizations to Care for Torch!

Birdsfoot Native Nursery and MSU Master Gardener's Program:

Master Gardener Lyn Petty installed a new butterfly garden in front of the Gallery, and Master Gardener Karen Swanson added more native plants to the pollinator garden. We're looking forward to future projects with our new partners.

Torch Lake Protection Alliance:

Two TCC volunteers serve on the project team for the Torch Lake Comprehensive Monitoring and Evaluation Project being conducted by the U.S. Geological Survey.

Torch Lake Protection Alliance and Three Lakes Association:

Our volunteers worked on two community outreach projects.

Lawn Care Campaign:

Distributed "Don't Fertilize" signs to 100 landowners in the Torch Lake Watershed.

Shoreline Stewardship Campaign:

Developed and distributed 4,500 postcards promoting shoreline stewardship practices.

Elk River Chain of Lakes Watershed Protection Plan Implementation Team WPIT:

We meet regularly with 19 other nonprofits and government reps to implement the plan.

Working with Our Partners

Three nonprofits serve Torch Lake, each focusing on what they do best. We share resources—people, time and money—to improve communications to the community we serve and increase our impact on Torch Lake's future.

Dan Sajkowski - Kewadin, Michigan Torch Lake Protection Alliance (TLPA)

Dan grew up vacationing on Torch Lake in the 1960s and has wonderful memories of trolling for lake trout with his uncle in his wooden Thompson boat. Thirty years later, he introduced his family to the lake, but it wasn't until 2002 that he and his wife bought a home on the west shore. Then he joined TLPA and two years ago, he offered to serve on the Board. Now he leads as president, because he wants to give back to the lake.

After retiring from a career in the energy industry, Dan applied his background in chemical engineering to the project team for the Torch Lake Long-term Monitoring and Evaluation Project conducted by the U.S. Geological Survey. He's worked closely with TCC volunteers on this project.

"Torch Conservation Center has great people! They're credible with high integrity. They've been an asset to the USGS Project Team. TCC has a different outlook on living on the lake, and they offer people easy ways to take care of Torch."

"We do our best to follow best practices. We pump the septic tank every two years and we've removed invasive species from our yard. For 15 years, we've been treating a 100 year old ash tree growing along the shore to protect it from the invasive emerald ash borer. My wife is very interested in native plants, so we're working on a plan to restore the natural shoreline."

Community Partner Profile

Our vision is to support a well-informed community of local businesses, landowners and visitors who actively care for Torch Lake.

Rodger Dewey - Helena Township, Michigan

Rodger Dewey is the founder of Rodger's Grass-Fed Beef, LLC on the ridge overlooking Torch Lake, and Dewey Insurance in Kalkaska. A life-long resident of Helena Township, he purchased the original acreage from his parents in 1955. Rodger is one of only two cattle farmers in the Torch Lake Watershed. His "Farm to Table" operation provides an important source of food for residents and visitors.

"My goal is to make my land act as a sponge, so water soaks into it, not runs-off it," he explained. By transitioning his farmland away from conventional crops to grass-based grazing, Rodger cares for Torch Lake by decreasing nutrient inputs and erosion on his family farm.

Capitalizing on the relationship between his cows and the grass, he makes sure the pastures cycle organic matter, which increases the soil's capacity to hold water and nutrients. His land filters water, recharges the aquifer that feeds Torch Lake, and sequesters carbon. With his focus on the future, he ensures the sustainability of both his farm and our water quality.



Rodger has a "Welcome to the Torch Lake Watershed" sign on his land and has worked to remove invasive species, too. He supports Torch Conservation Center, because it is a small community-based organization working on the challenges of preserving a precious resource- our water!

Rodger thinks his actions on the farm are like the actions that waterfront landowners can take to care for Torch. By doing the right thing, you can *increase* infiltration of rainwater and *decrease* run-off and erosion pollution of the lake.

Our volunteers continue to amaze us with their willingness to lend a hand, their enthusiasm for our stewardship program, and their commitment to caring for Torch Lake.


Chris and Julie Coulter 2022 Volunteers of the Year

In 2019 Chris and his wife Julie took over the cottage that had been in his family for fifty years. They began living there full time the next year. Seeing a lot of changes in the lake over time inspired them to want to help out.

Chris and Julie are mindful of protecting the ecosystem by not fertilizing their lawn, keeping a natural buffer of native plants an appropriate distance from lake, and doing their part as riparian owners.

The Coulters support TCC because it has made them more educated about what can and needs to be done to preserve Torch Lake. Giving back to the lake is an important value to them, as is the bigger picture of taking care of the planet. They stated that:

"TCC provides information and steps to do that. Torch Lake is so beautiful, supporting TCC is the least we can do."

When Karen's master gardener program at MSU required a forty hour project involving the community, she chose to develop the native plant garden at the TCC Gallery. She also improved her own lakefront area with native plants, a rain garden, and rock placement to forestall erosion and return the habitat to its natural state. This work expanded to include a similar plan for her neighbors along the 1000ft condo shoreline.

Karen continues to maintain the TCC Gallery garden. She supports the TCC mission by educating others about native plant gardens, which not only prevent erosion, but also require less care, no fertilizer, and are more sustainable, all due to being natural to the area.




